
(1) Cut out main fabric, lining and interfacing if used.


(2) If using Interfacing, attach to WS of main fabric and treat as one. Interfacing will not be mentioned again in these notes.



Window measures 8cms x 5cms





Fix temporarily with adhesive tape whilst sewing plastic to fabric very close to folded edges around window. Remove adhesive tape.


(5) With RS together sew darts in main and lining fabrics, taking 0.5cm at raw edge and tapering to point. Press the


(6) With RS together join main fabric to lining at top and bottom of mask taking 1cm seam allowance. Leave sides of mask untouched.



(7) Pull main fabric gently through window hole in lining and pull mask into shape. Pin top and bottom of mask and press carefully, again avoiding plastic.


(8) Pin lining window to fit main window and on the lining side (a) sew about 0.5cm from window edge through all thicknesses.

Turn over and (b) stitch again on RS of Main fabric close to window through all thicknesses.





- (9) Turn under 0.5cm of side raw edges to lining side. Press.
- (10)Turn under again 2cms. Stitch next to inner fold to form casing, reinforcing well at both ends. Press.
- (11)Insert elastic or ribbon/cord etc. into casing using safety pin.
 If using elastic to form loop to go behind the ears, tie elastic using reef knot.
 If using ribbon/cord etc. to be used around the head, place a small single knot at each end to prevent fraying or unravelling.



(12)When completed pack each individual mask in a new sealable bag....medium size food/freezer bags ideal......and finally please insert note stating:

After washing at 60 degrees, smear a little dish/bar soap on inside of plastic and leave to dry. This helps prevent fogging
